

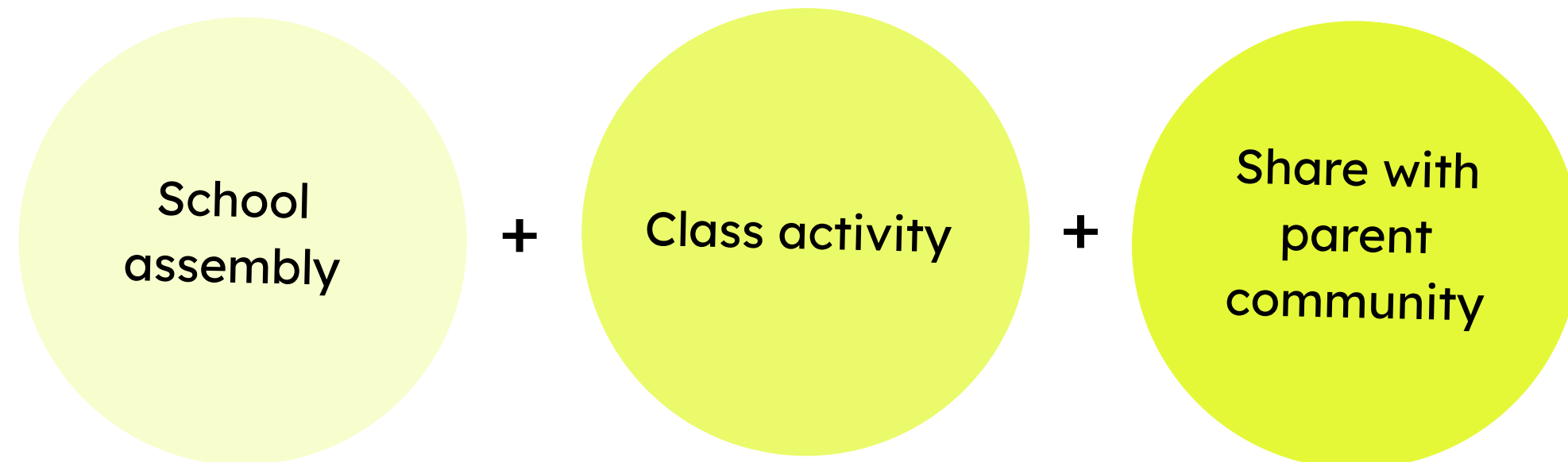
Team up with your school community

Netsafety Week 2026 is about helping students understand that online safety is not something you do alone: it's a shared responsibility, where everyone plays a role in creating safer, more positive online spaces.

Roll out activities for your students and school community to bring the whole team together to play their part in online safety.

Key Messages

- Online safety is a team effort – everyone has a role to play.
- Small actions make a big difference.
- What we do online affects others and our wider community.
- Positive online behaviour helps create safer, more connected spaces.
- If something goes wrong, support your team and get help.



Whole-school community activities

Celebrate Netsafety Week as a community with these whole-school activities and community activations.

The Team Board

Create a large school display built around five online safety team roles. Each role has a name, one-line description, a scenario, and one practical online safety action.

Use the matching Team Role cards alongside the display so students can see, choose and revisit the roles. They can write an action they will take on a card for the wall. This becomes the anchor visual for the week.

Daily Notice Ideas - Team Moves

Use a different 'team move' each day to keep the theme visible all week:

Mon: Think before you click

Tues: Be a Defender - speak up for someone online today

Wed: Check your settings - is your profile private?

Thurs: Be a Supporter - send a kind message to someone

Fri: Reflect - what was your team role this week?

Team-based competition

Award house or class points for participation, kindness, and supporting others.

Display the scoreboard daily in notices.

Kick-off Assembly

Online safety is a team sport - what role do you play?

Slippery Soccer: Make the safe play

Pause gameplay at key moments to ask questions like what should you do if someone's being unkind online? Good decisions protect the whole team - reward good answers with a free kick or bonus point.

Cray Crayfish dance challenge

Intermediate and Secondary activities

Kick-off Assembly

You are part of the online safety team. Your actions affect others.

Discussion prompts: What does playing your part look like online this wee? How can you support others if something goes wrong?

Scenario Workshop - How Does The Team Respond?

In small groups: discuss real online situations, who is affected and how each team role can take action for online safety.

Scenarios:

- Group chat conflict: private messages are screenshots and shared
- A manipulated photo of a student is circulating online
- Fake school page: confessions about students begin spreading and people are piling on in the comments
